## Course Description

The course consists of a 12-hour self-study course and an 8-hour live course, both developed by faculty of the University of Florida College of Medicine and the College of Pharmacy. It is intended to provide knowledge to pharmacists who will be administering influenza vaccine. Emphasis will be on influenza but the course may cover many aspects of preventable diseases.

Each participant must complete and pass the 12-hour home study module prior to the start of the live 8-hour course. The schedule for the live course will be in workshop format covering important aspects of immunizations and cardio pulmonary resuscitation.

## Learning Objectives

At the conclusion of the course participants should be able to:

- Relate the principles, scheduling, precautions, and contraindications for influenza vaccination.
- Describe the epidemiology of influenza and other vaccine-preventable diseases.
- Develop a screening technique to identify patients needing influenza immunization.
- Demonstrate protocol development with a physician in compliance with Florida state law, including record keeping, emergency procedures, and reporting requirements.
- Evaluate influenza vaccine information resources.
- Discuss the various safety procedures required of a pharmacy-delivered immunization services.
- Describe methods of compensation for immunization services.
- Explain the storage and handling requirements of influenza vaccines.
- Demonstrate techniques of vaccine administration for adults.
- Demonstrate a basic understanding of blood-borne pathogens
- Explain common modes of their transmission and methods of prevention
- Demonstrate successful completion of CPR training

## Continuing Education Credit

Participants attending the entire program, scoring at least 70% on the home-study and final exam, and demonstrating good vaccine administration technique, will earn 2.0 CEUs (20 contact hours) of continuing education credit. All participants will be certified in CPR during the program. If you are qualified in CPR this will be a refresher for you and you may be able to help others. University of Florida College of Pharmacy will mail Statements of CE credit to participants within 2 weeks following the completion of the course.

## Goals

Goals: This course serves to fulfill the requirements as established for Pharmacists to provide influenza vaccines to adults by Rule 64B16-26.1031 The goal of this course is to provide pharmacists in the State of Florida with knowledge of and skills in, immunology, the epidemiology of influenza, indications for vaccination and implementation and initiation of a pharmacy-based immunization program to make immunization delivery a part of pharmacy practice.

The Pharmacist's Immunization Course is a combination of twelve (12) hours of self-study and eight (8) hours of live activities. The live course will consist of updates according to the latest guidelines, training in CPR, and training in injection techniques.
